Topics

In this course, you will:

- Understand and determine when, where and why the lessee (or their assigns), under the terms of an oil and gas lease, has the right to build pipelines and related facilities for transporting hydrocarbons across an oil and gas lease.
- Examine the surface rights of the oil and gas lessee and how they relate to the responsibilities of Right of Way Agents / Surface Landmen in support of the pipeline industry.
- Apply this new knowledge to practical land and right of way issues in the oil and gas field, including building gathering systems and laterals, gathering system due diligence and gas storage field contractual construction.
